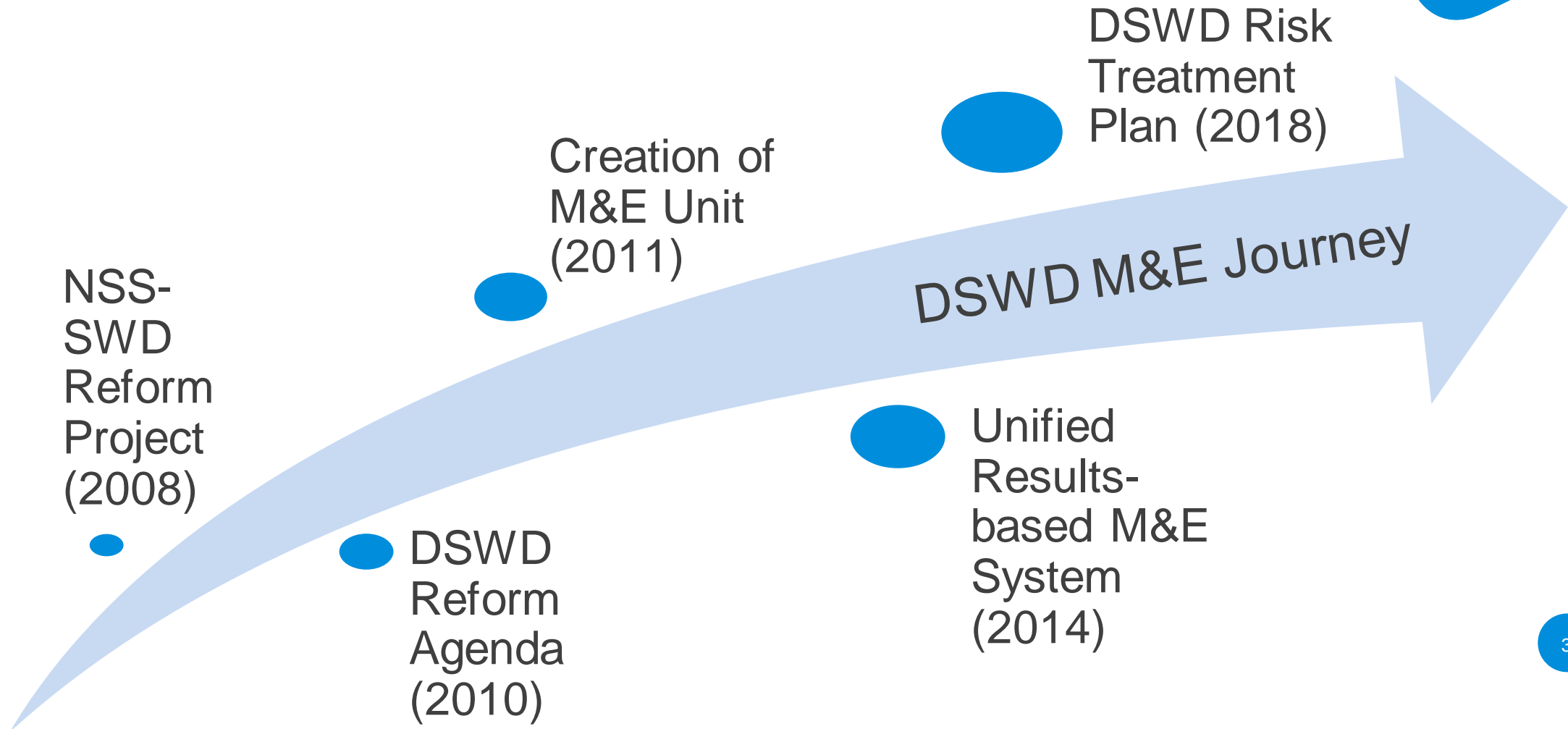

Objectives

- Institutionalize the formulation and monitoring of the *DSWD Research and Evaluation Agenda*
- Provide *standards and criteria* in the conduct of researches and evaluation studies in the Department



The DSWD Evaluation Policy

Approaches in Doing Evaluations



In-house

Initiated and conducted by DSWD Office/s and its personnel



Fully-outsourced

Initiated by an Office that is outsourced to a third-party service provider



Joint

Conducted in close partnership with an individual or team of consultants



The DSWD Evaluation Policy

Strategies

- Capacity Building
- Partnerships
- Incentive Mechanisms
- Advocacy Activities

Evaluations Conducted

- **Impact Evaluations**
(e.g. Pantawid, KALAHI-CIDSS Program)
- **Process Evaluations**
(e.g. Sustainable Livelihood Program, Core Shelter Assistance Program)
- **Other M&E Studies**
(e.g. BIA, case studies, tracer study)

Challenges

- Adequate budgetary support and human resources for M&E
- Incentive system/mechanisms for M&E

- Agencies should be more proactive and resourceful in promoting M&E
